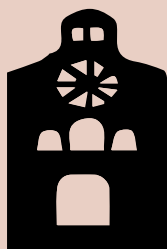

In May, we visited St Giles Church in Holme. Nigel, the church warden, showed us around the grade I listed church, built on a mound of sand. It dated back to the 12th century, but was enlarged to double its size by John Barton, a local wool merchant in 1485. The main door was moved at this time. The church has 2 aisles. John and his wife, Isabella, have a cadaver tomb inside. Isabella’s feet rest on her pet dog and John’s on a barrel which is a wordplay on his surname. The wall from the original church has a massive lean on it and buttresses have been built to support it twice. The pews date back to 1485 and have lovely carvings. There were further pews towards the front of the church which are now petrified wood. The carvings on the end of these were even more elaborate, with details of angels, dogs and birds. An interesting detail is a room above the porch known as Nan Scott’s Chamber. The story goes that she moved into this room to avoid the plague in 1666 but when she eventually left, only one other villager had survived. By the 19th century the church had fallen into a state of neglect, but in 1932 Nevil Truman, a historian and writer set about restoring the church. He wasn’t afraid of recycling and among other examples, he used stain glass from Sailsbury and the pulpit was originally at Caunton church, then made into a summerhouse, then donated to Holme to become a pulpit once more. Nigel talked us through the architecture and the artwork and also gave us an interesting fact about the River Trent which over the years had moved from one side of the church to the other.

In June, we visited Boultham park in Lincoln. Brant and Matthew led us. The park had once been part of an estate owned by the Ellison family. There were 6 Richard Ellisons in total, in a direct line down their family tree. Richard Ellison II was responsible for opening the first bank in Lincoln. (NatWest Smiths Bank branch on Lincoln High Street.) Richard Ellison III bought this land and built a house on it as a gift for his son, Richard Ellison IV. During this time, the house was extended with a large glass house and with Pennells introduced a new apple variety. Richard Ellison VI wanted to sell the property after he had inherited it but it was requisitioned to become a military convalescence home for World War I. It was also used as a Dig for Victory site, with sugar beet being grown. LCC bought the land in 1929 to become a public park and the house was demolished in 1959. Our guides showed us photos of the house and a walled area in the park now shows the imprint of the old house. The wrought iron park gates off Boultham Park Road bear the initials of Joseph Rushton, a big industrialist in times gone by. They once stood outside his home but were moved to Boultham Park. The park was large despite much of the original estate being sold off for new housing. There was a bandstand which is still in regular use. There was St Helen’s church, which was there from the 13th century. Our guides had a book of archive photos so we could compare now and then. We saw a dry fountain that had never worked as there was no plumbing attached. A photo showed it full of plants, whilst two Victorian children looked over it. There was a large manmade lake with a central island. We saw photos from when it was a boating lake. Boats could be rented for rowing but it closed as boats were regularly stolen! We also saw photos from when a miniature train was in the park and photos of the Boultham Park Baths which closed in 1978. A Hampden Bomber crashed right by the baths site in 1939, killing the 4 RAF crew.
